School Uniform

Wade Deacon pupils demonstrate their 'Commitment to Excellence' by wearing our Academy uniform with pride. Uniform appearance should be neat and tidy.



Our Uniform consists of the following:

- Black blazer with blue trim and school badge;
- Blue/Black tartan skirt or black trousers;
- White shirt;
- School tie, to be worn at a standard length, with school crest on display;
- Sensible plain black shoes;
- Plain white socks (no ribbons/bows) or navy-blue tights;
- Plain black V neck jumper;
- Scarves are permitted but must be worn outside;
- Hoodies are not acceptable on the school premises.

Appropriate School Footwear

Shoes must be black in colour. There should be no coloured stitching or coloured flashes visible on the shoe (excluding the small label on the side of Kickers school shoes).

Vivienne Westwood 'Melissa' style shoes, including those with a black logo are not permitted, see images on the below for further clarity; please do not purchase them.

Trainers or trainer style shoes are not permitted, please do not purchase them: this includes Hugo Boss, Cruyff, Adidas Stan Smith, Kickers or any other brands; the named examples are not an exhaustive list, please see images on the below for further clarity.

- Shoes must be able to be polished, please note that patent leather shoes are acceptable, however, suede leather is not permitted.
- Heels over 2cm are not allowed.
- No boots of any description are permitted,
- No platforms, sandals, slingbacks or fashion shoes are allowed.
- Canvas pumps will not be acceptable as school shoes or for use in Physical Education lessons.

Parents and carers must ensure that all property is clearly and indelibly marked with its owner's name. We recommend that large sums of money, valuable clothing or belongings should not be brought to school. The school's insurance policy does not cover loss or damage to personal belongings such as mobile phones.

Hair colour must be natural, any hair accessories (hairbands, clips or bobbles) must be black, royal blue or white.

Jewellery should not be worn.

No badges are to be worn other than those issued by the school.

Pupils are not permitted to wear nail polish or acrylic nails.

Pupils are not permitted to wear any form of facial or body piercing; this includes micro/clear studs.

RISE Points



We want to recognise and celebrate your achievements. Subject teachers issue comments on Synergy and award RISE Points in recognition of excellent achievement and participation. When you gain enough points they are exchanged for a lapel badge which informs everyone of your outstanding achievement.

There are 4 badges—each requiring more RISE points. Will you be able to earn a full set by the end of Y7?

Exceptional attitude to your work is also celebrated through phone calls, the sending of congratulatory postcards and letters, as well as invitations to special events.

Attendance & Punctuality

We expect that you will be able to maintain a full attendance record at school. However, if for example you are ill and unable to attend, or you will be late to school for any reason, then your parent or carer must contact the school via Synergy or telephone 0151 423 2721 by 9:00am each day of absence.

In order that you do not fall behind others in your class, you will be expected to catch up on work you have missed during your absence

The Wade Deacon target for attendance is 97% each year. Hit this target and you will have the best chance of achieving your potential!

Home Learning & Revision

Homework is a vital part of school life. It is used to support the work you complete in your lessons and provide you with opportunities to work independently. Each subject will provide homework for you on a weekly or two - weekly basis which will be recorded on Synergy.

Synergy is an easy-to-use online homework resource showing information, guidance and deadlines. All teachers publish their homework online to pupils' and parents' accounts.

Revision is extremely important. As you will undertake tests regularly throughout each year, it is essential that you are in the habit of regular revision. It is recommended that you take a 'little and often' approach, looking at one or two subjects each night for around 30-40 minutes.

To help you to revise and retain information, you will receive a Knowledge Organiser which you will use in class, during form period and in your home learning
